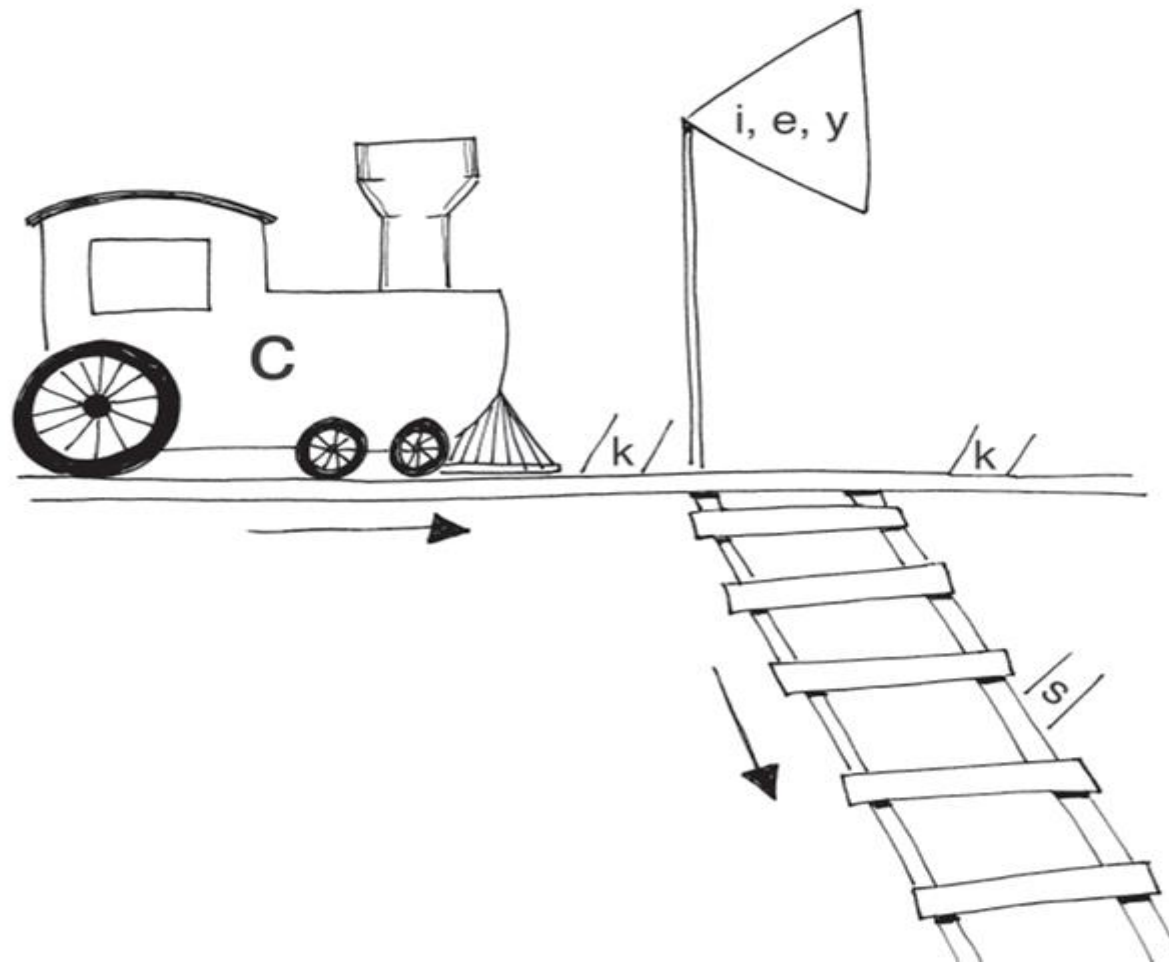

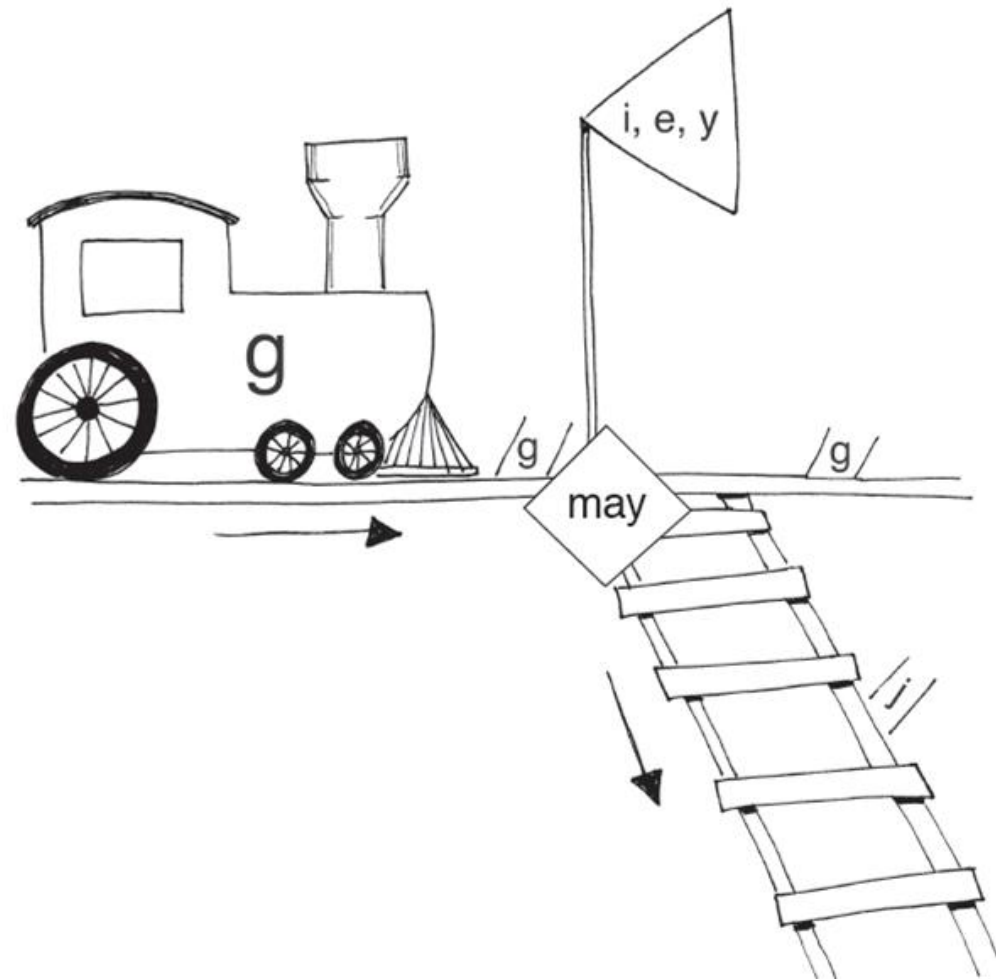

# Symbol imagery helps you read and spell correctly!

- ❖ Symbol imagery is a sensory tool that allows you to monitor and self-correct quickly
- ❖ You can quickly compare what you read to your own symbol imagery.
- ❖ Symbol imagery helps you
  - ❖ Sound out words,
  - ❖ Memorize sight words for quick and accurate reading in paragraphs and,
  - ❖ Spell phonetically AND accurately (give, not giv; teach, not teech; nature, not nachur).
- ❖ English can be tricky, but it is not hard when you can hear and visualize letters in words. Remember, You can do this. You can do anything.

# Vowels in syllables

- ❖ Mom has 1 vowel sound and 1 syllable.
- ❖ Mommy has 2 vowel sounds and 2 syllables.
- ❖ Happy has 2 vowel sounds and 2 syllables.
- ❖ Happiness has 3 vowel sounds and 3 syllables.
- ❖ Hippo has 2 vowel sounds and 2 syllables.
- ❖ Hippopotamus has 5 vowel sounds and 5 syllables.
- ❖ Little has 2 vowel sounds and 2 syllables.
- ❖ Feet has 1 syllable and 2 vowel letters that make 1 sound. They work as a team and you can only hear one vowel sound!
- ❖ Love has 1 syllable and 2 vowel letters, but one is silent so it doesn't count!
- ❖ Lovely has 2 syllables and 3 vowel letters!
